

# GRAVE OF THE MONTH

## James Tubb 1814-1893

James was born in Barwick Bassett, Wiltshire. His father was a farmer and James became a farmer too, down in Faccombe, on the road to Andover, at Netherton Farm.

When he retired, he moved with his first wife Caroline to Clayhill. By 1871 they were living in Mount Villas, the large house with a widow's walk, on the left of Newtown Road up from the cemetery.

He became very active in Newbury Baptist Church and was made a Deacon.

Caroline died in 1873 and James remarried Clara James from Faringdon in 1874. Clara died, aged 87, in 1914. There were no children from either marriage.

Unusually both his wives are buried with him.
