GRAVE OF THE MONTH



HARMAN SKINNER HANINGTON

1847 – 1901



(Buried 13 September, 1901)

Known by his middle name of Skinner. Born in Newbury; a nephew of George Higgons (the town's Mayor in 1842) whose business he inherited via his father Edward.

A draper and undertaker, based at 19 Northbrook Street which is now the site of Tesco Metro.

Elected to the Town Council in 1891; he celebrated his appointment as Mayor in 1894 by driving a steamroller through the town.

He was an Anglican, a Conservative, a J.P., a Freemason, Honorary Secretary of the Newbury Horticultural Society, Joint Secretary of the Library and Scientific Society, a Volunteer Fireman, etc.

A major player and organiser of their events for both the Newbury Amateur Dramatic Society, and the Christy Minstrels where he frequently took the part of 'Mr. Tambourine'.
